

THE 39th ANNUAL WINNETKA ANTIQUES SHOW

- WHAT:** The Woman's Board of the Winnetka Community House sponsors the 39th Annual **Winnetka Antiques Show** the weekend of March 7. Over one hundred women, both Active and Sustaining, serve on the Woman's Board. The show is managed by Keeling Wainwright Associates. The Winnetka Antiques Show offers an extensive variety of art and antiques for all collectors and is well known for quality and value.
- SHOW HOURS:** Show hours are: Friday, March 7 from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Saturday, March 8, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and Sunday, March 9, from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m. Bar, beverages and full luncheon available daily.

- ATTENDANCE:** The Winnetka Antiques Show welcomes over 3,000 people throughout the course of the weekend.
- PREVIEW PARTY:** A preview party will be held on Thursday, March 6, 2008, from 6:30pm to 9:30pm at the Winnetka Community House. Cocktails and a dinner buffet will be served. Approximately 600 guests are anticipated each year to celebrate the show's opening. Tickets purchased in advance are \$125 per person, \$135 at the door, and include a 3-day Show admission.
- BOOTH SEMINARS:** Expert dealers will present complimentary seminars in their respective booths during the Show. Show admission is required to attend these booth lectures.
- ADMISSION:** Show admission is \$15 for a three-day pass.
- DEALERS:** The Antiques show invites over 50 outstanding and knowledgeable dealers from across the U.S., England and Europe presenting and offering their first-rate collections. These experts will also be available to answer show goers questions personally.
- BENEFIT:** All proceeds from the Antiques Show support the programs and services of the Community House, a non-tax supported organization that is dependent on a broad base of community support for its existence. The Winnetka Community House was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on August 30, 2007, by the National Park Service. The Woman's Board has been the primary financial supporters of this initiative. Founded in 1911 as a nondenominational gathering place for the village, the Community House's programs sprang to life immediately with a variety of clubs and activities for all ages.
